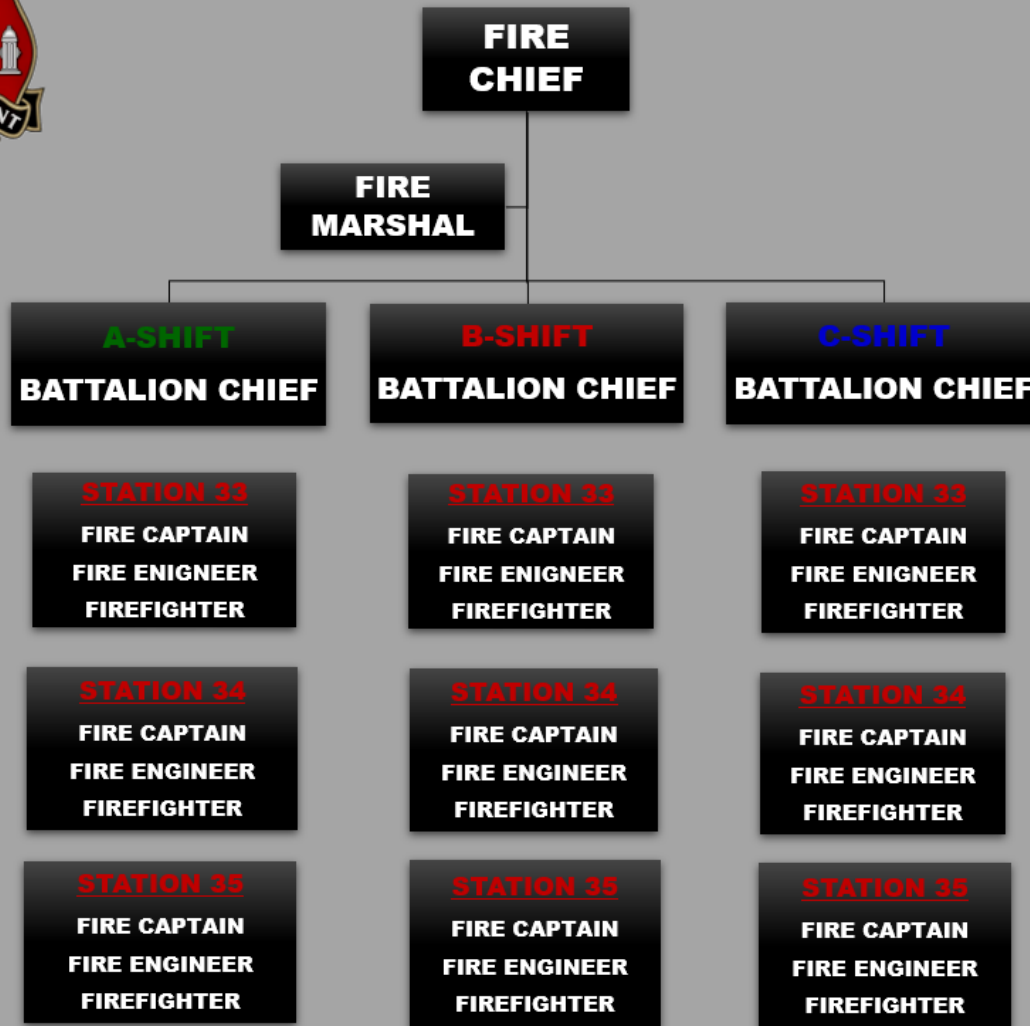

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

Lincoln Fire Department has been protecting the community since 1896, beginning as Lincoln Hose Company #1, a volunteer organization built on hometown service. As Lincoln grew, the department transitioned from an all-volunteer model to a modern, fully staffed fire agency.

Today, Lincoln Fire operates three fire stations with full-time personnel and a Battalion Chief overseeing daily operations. The department continues to expand its capabilities, investing in training, personnel, and equipment to meet the needs of one of the region's fastest-growing cities.

Guided by the Fire Chief and supported by the Fire Marshal, Lincoln Fire provides all-risk emergency response, fire prevention, development review, and community risk reduction services. The department remains committed to continuous improvement and professional excellence.

Lincoln Fire is also a strong community partner. From the annual Santa Tour to long-standing events like the Turkey Drive, the department continues traditions that strengthen the bond between firefighters and the residents

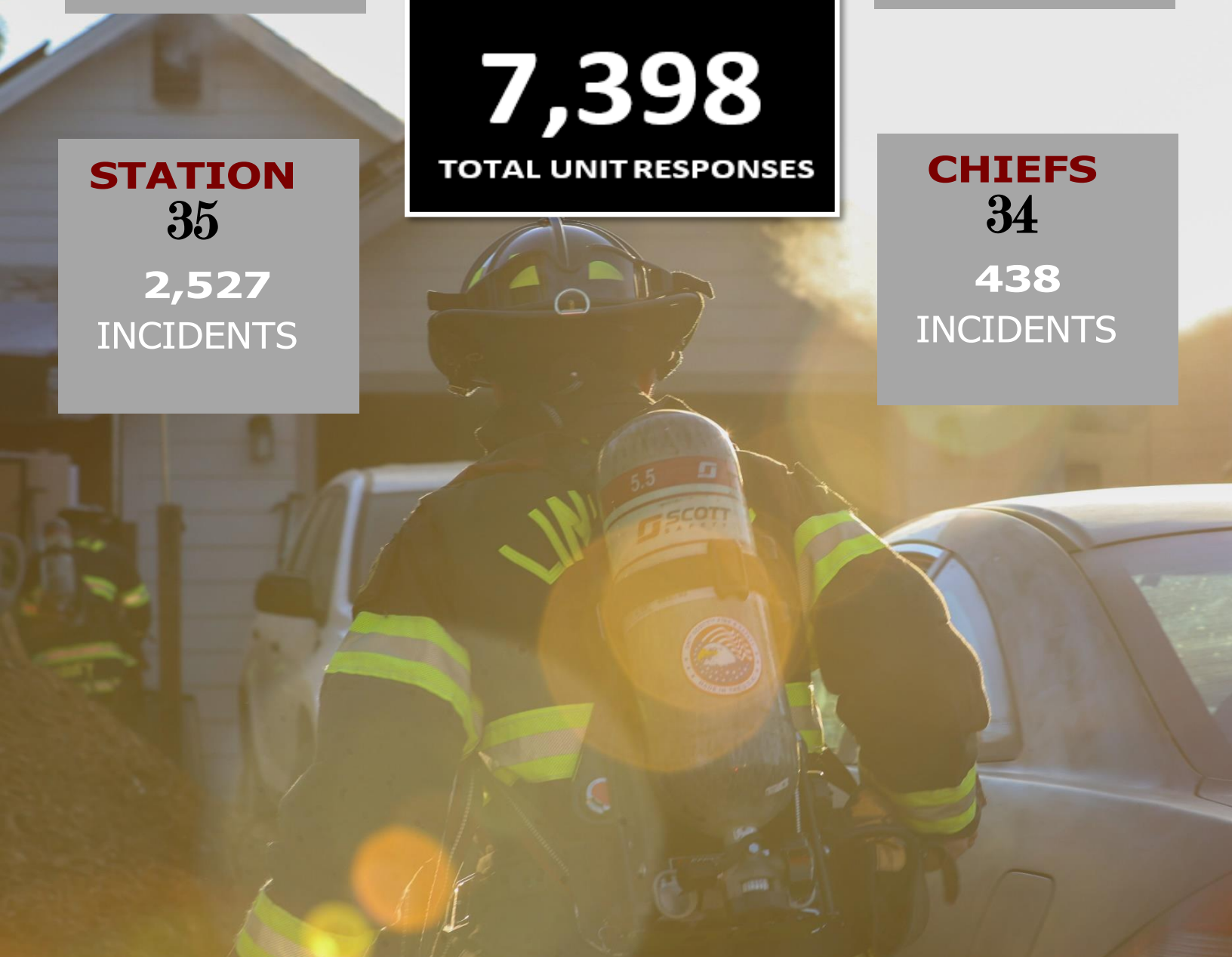

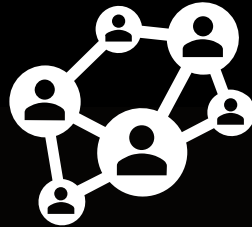

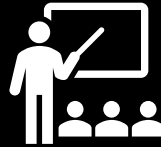
